1. INTRODUCTION -

For building any cultured society "Education' in a format way is inevitable. One can not visualise strong, reacting demanding & developing society without 'Education'. Education is the best tool for channelising the youth power in the national stream. The conventional meaning of education is a formal imparting of knowledge within the four walls. The focus of higher education has been shifted to practical oriented courses. Employment opportunities should be created through the education.

As per the demand of time and unavailability of trained social workers, the "College of Social Work" was started in the year 1996 at Jalgaon. The students of college has achieved bright success in every field of academics & non curricular activities.

The classroom work is reinforced at the time of field works where students are exposed to practical experiences. Through this, we strive to provide the society sensitive and responsible civic social workers.

2. ABOUT THE INSTITUTE -

Late Dhanaji Nana Chaudhari, resigned the British Government Service and joined, the national freedom movement. He started "Ashram" at Khiroda, Tal. Raver, Dist. Jalgaon to promote basic education in the nearby villages. The Ashram's activities gradually enhanced in the larger interest of the society and ultimately elevated to formation of a formal institute duly registered under the laws as "Janta Shikshan Mandal". To commemorate the birth centenary of this revered freedom fighter, Janta Shikshan Mandal decided to undertake academic projects. **College of Social Work** is one of the project undertaken. Initially this college was started at Khiroda town. However for catering the need of the masses of entire district, the college has been shifted to Jalgaon from the year 1996-97. This college has become renowned in the state of Maharashtra under the best guidence of **Loksevak Balasaheb Madhukarrao Chaudhari**, a well known educationist, who nurtured the growth and prosperity of the education in the state of Maharashtra.

The Dhanaji Nana Chaudhari Vidyaprabodhini (DNCVP) is the organization envisaged by our former Chairperson and ex-education minister Late Shri. Madhukarao Chaudhari for social reforms in higher education with focus to social work education. The Janata Shikshan Mandal is the parent organization where the rich legacy of education reforms and community developments were started by the work of late freedom fighter Shri. Dhanaji Nana Chaudhari. The organizational work extension in tribal hamlets of Satpuda range to the various villages of Raver and Yawal blocks is continuous under the able leadership of Shri. Shirish Dada Chaudhari, Chairperson of DNCVP and former MLA. The institutions of the organization as Ashram Schools, UG, PG colleges and various training centres are not only existing at remote areas of Jalgaon district as Savda, Faizpur, Sakegaon, Jalgaon even in metros as Mumbai.

In year 2006-07, a research study centre affilated with NMU, Jalgaon for M.Phil. in Social Work and Sociology subject was established at the college. The senior faculty of the staff worked as co-ordinator. A single batch of 13 students was awarded M.Phil degree by NMU, Jalgaon. The students are encouraged to do their research projects in the industries and NGO's outside of the campus. In the last four academic years, 390 students have involved in research project works.

The following facilities are available in the college to facilitate research:

- o Subscribing journals to the college library.
- o Library provided with Wi-Fi connectivity.
- o The computer lab with internet connectivity for the staff,
- o Special leave for data collection and to meet the research guide,
- o On duty facility to attend conferences, seminars and to present papers,
- o Encouragement to staff for publishing research articles in journals to inculcate research aptitude and knowledge.

The following efforts are taken to develop scientific temper and research culture among the students:

- o Encouraging PG students to participate in seminars and symposium; motivate the PG students of MSW and UG students of BSW to undertake research project work on campus and off campus. For instance, in the last four academic years nearly about 143 UG students and 247 PG students carried out the project work.
- Staff guides the students for completing the project work. Encouraging participate in national level workshop and motivate the staff and students to present papers in such seminars.
- o Students of MSW and BSW undertake field work to carryout survey for data

- collection and perform the analysis of the data collected.
- Regular industrial visits to industries such as Raymond Pvt. Ltd., Parle Pvt. Ltd.,
 Vikas Milk federation, Bosch Pvt. Ltd. and Madhukar Co-operative Sugar Factory etc. are arranged for the students of the social work stream.

10 staff members of the college have been awarded Ph.D. in which four members Dr. Umesh D. Wani, Dr. Yashwant G. Mahajan, Dr.Rakesh P. Chaudhari and Dr. Sunita P. Chadhari are the research guide recognized by the KBC North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon. They are guiding 22 research scholars.

Some of the thrust areas in which the faculties are currently doing their research work

- o Tribal Vaidhu's traditional medical practice in the Khandesh region
- o Social Impact Assessment of the Tapi irrigation project
- o Jal Swaraj and Rural Development
- o CSR project of industries
- o School Education and child labour

Three faculties of the Institute are completed Minor Research projects under Vice Chancellor Research Scheme of the KBC N.M.U. Jalgaon. They received grants of Rs. 50,000/- each for this project. While are faculty got research project from TRTI grant of Rs. 3.5 lakhs.

The institution organized a field work training programme for youth, farmers and school going children. The workshop on Research Methodology was sponsored by ICSSR-WRC. It provided an ideal platform to motivate the young graduates, scholars and the budding scientists to know more about the methodologies on scientific research and its foundational techniques. It helped the researchers and students' participants from colleges and universities to know more about the current state of technology that could be adopted for betterment of community. College of MSW adopts thirty seven villages in Jalgaon district and it takes a survey on the various rural development schemes and social issues at Gram Panchayat level. One day consultation and interaction programme for 17 village Panchayat Presidents is conducted every year before initiating the college fieldwork programme. The college plans various activities through College's Fieldwork Programme based on the needs highlighted by village Presidents.

The college has organized seminars under the University approval with interdisciplinary approach. About 15 faculty members from our and other colleges in Jalgaon and totally 20 students from our college and other colleges have participated in the seminar i.e. Sustainable Rural Development: Social Challenges.

The research and development committee of the college collects information of various funding agencies and encourages the staff to apply to the agencies.

Dr. Prashant Bhosale, Assistant Professor, has completed a major research project title as "An Investigation in to tribal traditional medicinal system among Vaidhu Community of Khandesh region" to the ICSSR in 2013 seeking a grant of Rs.4,96,000/-. In 2011-12 CSR department of Airport Authority of India provided Rs.29, 000/- funds for baseline study of Primary School and Anganwadi of Village Kusumba. The three faculties of college Dr. Sunita Chaudhari, Mr. Ashok Hanwate, Mr. Nilesh Chaudhari had successfully completed their minor research projects under VCRMS KBCNMU, Jalgaon. The duration of the research projects were two years and seeking grants of Rs. 50,000/-i.e. total Rs. 1,50,000/-

The research studies have been carried out by the college during the past 3 academic years to benefit the community. The college of social work has initiated and completed social surveys in 2013-2014 covering on the people participation in social development process special focus to the rural areas of Raver and Yawal blocks. The findings of the study have been communicated to various Panchayat and political leaders of ruling and opposition party. The College of Social Work, Jalgaon has conducted a survey to improve the milk production and collection in the rural area of Jalgaon district. It was funded by the National Dairy Development Board. The significant findings of the report are:

- o It helped to improve research survey skills in the students
- o It played role of advocacy tool in formulating and change in policy to affect betterment of beneficiaries.
- o The role of people participation and its present status in communities were studied. It gave firsthand experience to the students and staff.
- o The objective of 'Class to field and Field to class' teaching and learning was achieved.

In the year 2015 the Institute is accredited with Grade 'A' by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore.

Its very pride moment for us that our college is associated with Central Govt. MHRD in which college is working as participating agency on dream project of MHRD i.e. Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and college also selected by RUSA for infrastructural development grants of Rs. 2 crore through this grants college planned to develop various infrastructural facilities.

8. Information About B.S.W. COURSE (BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK) :-

I. Eligibility (for B.S.W. Course):-

A student should passed Higher secondary examination $(10+2)=12^{th}$ or equivalent certificates course from Art, Commerce, Science and MCVC discipline. The candidates should produce all the relevant documents in original at the time of preliminary admission procedure.

III. THEORY SUBJECTS:-

There will be 30 theory subjects (including English subject of 100 marks each in I - semester, III - semester, V- semester respectively). In each semester of B.S.W. course "semester wise examination" for each theory paper of 60 marks will be conducted by the university. Mid term assessment for 40 marks will be conducted by the concerning college in each semester of B.S.W. course (prescribed as per the examination having 60:40 pattern) for six semester of B.S.W. course. The students who have failed in any subject may appear for university level semester examination.

IV. FIELD-WORK (Internal Assessment)

- a) No grace marks shall be allowed for passing in field work.
- b) The Social Work Practicum of the student shall be supervised by the faculty supervisor.
- c) Hours of Social Work Practucum : The Duration of Concurrent Practice Learning shall be a minimum of 12 Twelve Clock Hours spread over two days in a

week covering total 24 days in an academic session.

- d) All the Social Work Practicum Records shall be preserved / retained by the college for a Period minimum of Three years from the date of University Examination.
- e) The student who fails in Social Work Practicum shall be declared as "Fail" and shall have to repeat the same process in the next subsequent semester including theory courses.
- f) Absence from activities covered under the head Social Work Practicum shall lead to Forfeiting of the entire marks allocated to the said activity. There shall be no substitute for these activities.
- g) Orientation and Internal Viva-Voce Examination components are compulsory. Students will not be get admission in the next semester till they fulfill these criterions.
- h) Social Work Practicum records shall include Social Work Practicum journal file. Attendance sheets, conference sheets diary etc.
- i) The concerned affiliated college / department of social work which impart social work training to the students shall prepared the Social Work Practicum Manual prescribed by NMU, Jalgaon based on the guidelines of UGC Model Curriculum in Social Work Education related to Social Work Practicum component.
- j) Field work shall be of 100 marks (4 credit) for each semester. The total of field work Marks for six semester shall be 600 (24 credit)
- k) Field work shall be conducted at a social welfare agencies / organization selected by the college.
- I) A weekly individual conference of about 15 minutes, related to field work task of every student shall be conducted by the concerned field work supervisor. Field work shall Evaluate internally by a concerned Field work supervisor.
 - m) 90% attendance at field work is compulsory.
 - n) In any case, there shall be no revaluation moderation of Field work marks.
- o) Participation in Rural camp of 5-7 days organized by the college shall be compulsory for every students appearing for the second semester. The Rural camp shall be a graded activity to develop understanding among the students about rural community and their lifestyle and problems. The student performance will be evaluated on the basis of participation, initiatives, skills and discipline.
- p) Study tour is compulsory for students of S.Y.B.S.W. IV semester. It is helpful the students about field realities and give exposure to the learners about the setting in social work and its challeges.

- q) Special Awareness Campaign the students shall participate in special awareness campaigns such as HIV AIDS, Child labour, Dowry, female feticides, Gender, Human rights etc. At least five issue based campaigns should be organized during the semester.
- r) Each and every student should compulsory to attend and individually present seminar on various issues with the help of PPT, present seminar on field work task. Book or articles review.

V. RESEARCH DISSERTATION

- 1) Students of Vth semester are required to select an appropriate topic for their research dissertation in the beginning in consultation with the Research Guide and complete the same in the VIth semester. It shall be submitted to the university before commencement of VIth semester Examination and it must be signed by the concerned research Guide and Principal of the college.
- 2) Every faculty shall contribute at least half hours per student per week for research guidance to be given to the students assigned to him/her. The Research dissertation shall carry 100 marks and shall have External and Internal assessment on the basis of 60:40 patterns.
- 3) The Viva-Voce on Research dissertation will be evaluated externally for 50 marks.
- 4) The research report must be three copies of type written and well bound copies.
- 5) Sample size for Research dissertation will not be exceeding than 50.

VIVA-VOCE (External)

External Viva-voce of 50 marks will be conducted for 50 marks at the end of VIth semester based on Research Dissertation. However the candidate failing in viva-voce may attend the viva voce within three months from the date of declaration of the results as per university schedule. In such case candidate will have to pay extra fees prescribed by the university.

1. Six semester viva-voce examination of 50 marks shall be conducted externally by the University and carry 2 credits.

VI. Head of Passing

The following shall be separate head of passing

1) Written Theory	40%
2) Field work	50 %
3) Research dissertation	50 %
4) Viva-voce of 50 marks External assessment	50 %

Failure in any one of the head shall be considered failure at the B.S.W. course.

VII. Rules pertaining to conduct of examination and standard of passing

- 1) The Mid-term examination of each semester will be conducted by the college.
- 2) Two Mid-term examination shall be of 40 marks and shall be taken in each semester before semester end university level examination. There should one month gap between each internal examination of 20 marks.

The examination of each semester will be of 60 marks held by the university. The examination papers will be set by the panel of paper setters appointed by the university and answer books will be assessed externally. The question paper will be set on the syllabus of concerned subjects of 60 marks and written examination will be of 2 (two) hours duration.

IX. SELECTION PROCEDURE:-

The seats of BSW shall be filled up according to merit (percentage of marks at H.S.C. or equivalent level) and Reservation. The reservation of seats for the backward class students and female candidates as per the rule of North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon and Government of Maharashtra.

List of selected candidates will be displayed on the college notice board only.

9. INFORMATION ABOUT M.S.W. COURSE (MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK) -

I. Eligibility:-

Graduates of any recognized by the University Grants Commission shall be eligible to apply for the MSW degree programme. The 50% of the sanctioned seats will be reserved for BSW degree holders on merit basis, strictly following the rules of reservation for different categories including 10% seats for other universities. The remaining 50% seats will be selected according to merit (the percentage of marks at any recognized degree exam + percentage of marks at the Entrance test.) and reservation. The Merit list will be prepared by considering the percentage of marks at the graduation and the entrance test. It will be conducted by the College or the University as the case may be. The admission procedure will be transparent and further for any complaints in admission procedure the college administration will be responsible.

II. THE SELECTION PROCEDURE (For M.S.W. COURSE):-

After a scrutiny of the applications, the selected candidates will be called for the written test followed by an interview. The written test would be mainly to evaluate the expression skill, general awareness and basic numerical ability of the candidate. In the interview, questions may be asked on the subjects of the graduation level. The candidates are expected to know about the prospective field of specialisation. The questions based on general knowledge and current affairs are expected. List of meritoriously selected candidates will be displayed only on the college notice board.

The selected candidates should pay the required admission fees within the specified number of days from the date of their provisional admission, failing to do so will lead to cancellation of admission.

III. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-

The candidate must apply only on a prescribed form attached to the prospectus of the Institution. The Prospectus of the College will clearly indicate the

reservation of seats as per the Government and University norms, dates of sale of prospectus, last date for submission of the filled up forms, date of entrance test, date of declaration of the selection list and waiting list and the last date of admission. The selected candidate must, at the time of admission, produce all original certificates (SSC, HSC, and Graduation, caste certificate, Domicile Certificate, Income Certificate, Non-creamy layer certificate and other relevant certificates or documents) and marklists. The candidate shall have to pay the full fees as prescribed by the University .The Principal of the College may grant concession at his own discretion. The scholarship holders may totally be exempted from paying the fees save nominal admission fees. Candidates will have to obtain their Transference Certificate indicating successfully last attended college and the Examination. The candidates who have passed their last qualifying Examination from a University other than North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon must submit a migration certificate immediately after securing admission. As per North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon rules every candidate must obtain an eligibility certificate. A student who fails to obtain the eligibility certificate will not be permitted to appear for the Semester IV Examination.

Reservation of Seats:-

There will be reservation of seats for the backward class students and the female candidates as per rules of North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon and the Government of Maharashtra.

IV. Medium of Instruction:-

- 1. The medium of Instruction will be English. However, as North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon has allowed students to write examination answer books in Marathi suitable instructions may be given in the regional language i.e Marathi.
- 2. MSW Course Semester Pattern : (60:40 Marks)

Each Theory Paper for 100 Marks consists of 60 marks for university exam and 40 marks for internal assessment. The internal assessment for 40 marks shall be based on marks secured in the test and personal performance of the student.

V. Discipline:-

Students are expected to follow all rules and maintain discipline throughout the course period. Ragging in any form, within or outside the campus, is strictly prohibited. In case a student is found violating the rules of discipline, the Principal of the College

shall take stringent action against him/her.

VI. Grant of terms :-

100 percent attendance at Field Work and class Room teaching sessions is required for a student to be eligible for successful completion of academic term. In very exceptional circumstances leave with prior permission of the Principal of the College may be granted with a condition of compensating the loss of educational days within the limit of 80%. The Principal of the college shall have the responsibility of and control over all matters pertaining to discipline and professional behavior.

XI. Field Work:

Total marks 600, per semester 150 marks.

- The respective affiliated Institutes/ Colleges may develop the field work modules and manual according to the available field opportunities in their region. The field work over 4 semesters will include concurrent field work, Orientation Visits, Special Awareness campaigns, Rural Camp, Study Tour and Block Field Work placement etc.
- II) Field Work shall be of 150 marks (6 credits) for each Semester. The total of field work marks for four Semesters shall be 600 (24 credits).
- III) Field work shall be conducted during a period of two days a week for 15 (fifteen) clock hours
- IV) Field work shall be conducted at a social welfare agency/organization selected by the college. Every student shall be supervised by an experienced/professional social worker from the agency and a faculty member of the college
- V) A weekly Individual Conference of about 15 minutes, related to field work of every student, shall be conducted by the concerned Field Work Supervisor. Field Work shall be evaluated internally by a panel of 03 faculty members including the Field Work Supervisor.
- VI) 90% attendance at Field work is compulsory.
- VII) A student failing in field work at any Semester shall be declared as 'Fail' and shall have to repeat the entire Semester including theory courses.
- VIII) In any case, there shall be no revaluation or moderation of Field Work marks.
- IX) Participation in Rural Camp of 5-7 days organized by the college shall be compulsory for every student appearing for the Second Semester Exam. The Rural Camp shall be a graded activity to develop the understanding among the students about rural community and problems for intervention. 20 marks shall be

- allotted to this activity under the head of Field Work. The Students performance should be assessed on the basis of their participation, initiative, skills and discipline.
- X) Study tour is compulsory for Students of M.S.W IV Semester. It is a graded activity to orient the students about field realities and give exposure to the learners about the settings in social work and its challenges. 20 marks out of 100 marks earmarked for Field Work shall be allotted to this activity and the student's performance should be assessed on the basis of their participation, report writing, skills and discipline.
- XI) Skill Lab is a learning activity which is non graded activity organized for the students to develop their skills in order to develop their understanding to relate theory to practice and for their professional development.
- XII) Special awareness campaigns -- the students shall participate in special awareness campaigns such as HIV/AIDS awareness, issues of Child labour, Environment, Civil Rights etc. organized by the college under the guidance of faculty supervisor. At least two issue based campaigns should be organized during the Semester.
- XIII) Issue based Paper, Book review, Website Review Presentation. Every student should make a presentation on social issues and agencies working on them, book review etc.. (At least one presentation during the Semester)

XII. Research Dissertation (M.S.W. IV Semester)

Every faculty shall devote at least 4 Hours per week for research guidance to be given to the students assigned to him/her. The Research dissertation shall carry 150 Marks and shall have internal and external Assessment on the bases of 60:40 patterns.

The M.S.W. students admitted to the Third Semester shall select a research topic in the beginning of the third semester for project work in consultation with the Research Guide. Sample for the project report should be selected as per the requirement of Research Topic, where the sampling Method is used.

Every student shall submit three typed and well bound copies of such project report 15 days before the commencement of the Fourth Semester examination. The project report shall carry a total of 150 marks and shall be treated as a separate head of passing. A candidate must obtain minimum 75 marks for passing under this head. The project report at MSW IV Semester Examination should be assessed internally and externally by concerned examiner appointed by the College / University.

A candidate failing at this head shall submit a research report as prescribed by the University within a period of three months from the date of the results and shall pay applicable fees along with examination form.

Prescribed Standard for Research Dissertation:

- 1. The topic of research must be related to the area of social work.
- 2. The candidate must follow the scientific process and methods of social work research or social research.
- 3. The Report submitted to the University must be duly signed by the Principal and

concerned research Guide and shall also be certified by the Guide as to originality of the short term research work.

- 4. The content of the Report shall not cause any dispute or defamation to any person or the Institution.
- 5. Any malpractice including any attempt at plagiarism exposed even at a later stage may invite withdrawal of the Degree of such a candidate.

XIII. Viva Voce Examination:

The Viva voce will be conducted for 50 marks each at the end of Semester II and IV. The viva voce constitutes a separate head of passing. A candidate failing in viva voce of second Semester shall be eligible for admission to the fourth Semester. A candidate failing in Fourth semester Viva voce conducted by the external examiner shall be declared Fail at the M.S.W Examination. However, he may attend the viva voce within three months from the date of declaration of the results as per University schedule. In such a case he will have to pay the extra fees as per the decision of University to time to time.

- 1. There shall be a Viva-Voce Examination at the end of IInd and IVth Semester based on theory knowledge, research and field work practicum.
- 2 In the second semester Viva-Voce of 50 marks will be conducted before the commencement of the Second Semester examination by the Colleges and a statement of the marks obtained by the students shall be submitted to the University by the Heads of the Institutions for inclusion in the mark sheet. The minimum marks required for passing the Viva Voce are 25 for each Viva-Voce examination.
- A student failing in Viva-Voce (Semester II) shall be called again for the Viva Voce within one month of the date of declaration of the Second Semester Examination results. Only one repeat Viva Voce shall be permissible to be conducted during the Second Semester. However a student failing in the Second Semester Viva Voce Examination shall be eligible for admission to the MSW Third Semester.
- 4. Fourth Semester Viva-Voce Examination of 50 marks shall be conducted externally by the University.
- 5 The Viva Voce conducted in the Fourth semester shall be based on theory, field work, research, professional development and related area of specialization.

XIV. Block placement:

- 1 Every student shall complete his/her block field work for a period of one month i.e. 30 days after the fourth Semester examination. The Result of the candidates would be handed over to the College only after submission of a report on completion of Block Field Work to the University. The Certificates indicating clearly successful completion of Block Field Work by the students shall be retained by the concerned College.
- 2 After completion of Block placement, the student must submit a report of work to

- the Head/ Principal of the College/ Institute. Ordinarily, no leave of absence will be permissible during the stipulated period of the block field work placement.
- 3 Every student is required to complete his/her block field work in a welfare/development agency. Block field work placement in a Gram Panchayat, co-op society or a PHC shall not be allowed.
- 4 The Block Field Work shall be organized by a faculty nominated by the Principal.

XV. Heads of Passing, Standard of Passing, Credit Pattern and Grade Points:

- 1 The following shall be the independent heads of passing:
 - 1. Written theory papers
 - 2. Field work
 - 3. Research Dissertation
 - 4. Viva Voce
- 2 Standard of passing Marks: Percentage
- a. Written theory papers in each 40% Marks paper (Aggregate of 100- inclusive of both 60 external and 40 internal marks)
- b. Field work in every semester 50% Marks
- c. Viva Voce 50% Marks
- d. Research dissertation 50% Marks (Aggregate of 100- inclusive of both 60 external and 40 internal marks)

XVI. Rules of ATKT:

- A students must pass in 4 theory courses in each semester out of 6 courses to avail of the benefit of ATKT for the next semester and he/she must clear the backlog in the next semester examination. Their internal assessment marks will not change.
- 2. A students shall be allowed to keep term of Semester- III, (MSW-II), if he/she has no backlog and clears all the heads of passing of Semester- I.
- 3. A student failing in Field Work at any Semester shall not get the benefit of ATKT including theory papers and will have to repeat the entire semester.
- 4. In any case, for what so ever reasons, if a student does not appear or fails in any semester examination will have to repeat the entire semester.

कर्मवीर भाऊराव पाटील कमवा व शिका योजना :

कर्मवीर भाऊराव पाटील कमवा व शिका ही पदवी व पदव्युत्तर शिक्षण घेणा-या विद्यार्थ्यासाठी आहे, तसेच आर्थिकदृष्ट्या दुर्बल घटक, होतकरु व गरजू विद्यार्थ्याच्या उच्च शिक्षणासाठी ही योजना आहे. या योजनेचा उद्देश स्वावलंबनाने विद्यार्थ्याला श्रमाची आवड निर्माण करणे, श्रमाची प्रतिष्ठा वाढविणे. स्वयंरोजगारासाठी विद्यार्थ्याना प्रवृत्त करणे आदि मुख्य उद्देश योजनेच आहेत. योजनेत विद्यार्थ्यान अध्ययनाच्या वेठ्येव्यतिरिक्त किमान तीन तास काम करणे अपेक्षीत आहे. या योजनेद्वारे विद्यार्थ्याना आर्थिक लाभ मिळतो.
