Ph.D. work of faculties and students at college is continuously supervised from the beginning of the entrance test till the Viva Voce examination. Guidance is prescribed for smooth conduct of research with necessary infrastructure in the college campus.

College has a well established intranet facility within the campus. Unique Library Software (LIB-MAN) is being used for maintenance of Library. Data Entry (Books, Journals, Membership), Transaction (Issue, Return, Renewal and Fine Collection). Digital Library is maintained with software to upload and upgrade the various e- resources (Books, Journals and database). Our Library subscribes to the UGC N-List programme. Intranet and Internet facility are available for the users. The entire campus has access to Wi-Fi.

We firmly believe that the success-story has been that outcome of the Team work of the Teaching – Nonteaching staff, carried out under the able guidance of the liberal, considerate and pragmatic management. Therefore, a very 'down to earth' action plan was chalked out, the results of which are as given below –

- Infrastructure Development: The College shifted in its own building in April 2015. The infrastructure construction work was completed with well furnished interior and electrification. The new College infrastructure consists of 7 class room, one cabin each for Principal, Administrative office, Staff room with separate cubical to each faculty, Library with reading room for students and staff, ICT centre, ladies room and Conference hall etc. The conference hall, computer lab and Research Project office of the College is on the first floor whereas the Boys room, Girls room, NSS and sport room are also established on the basement. Based on the academic growth and requirements in terms of needed infrastructure and resources, the Board of Management allocates the budget for fulfilling the requirements. The Secretary of the College, in consultation with the members of the executive Board of Management undertakes establishing the required facilities within stipulated time that provide all the required faculties for effective teaching and learning.
- There were various programmes of guest lecture, seminar, endowment lectures were conducted at the college level as planned at the beginning of the academic year.
- The college has taken a serious effort to motivate students to come in large numbers for various special programmes like remedial classes for English and mentoring.
- A review meeting is organised at the end of various college programmes to analyze and find out areas of improvement. It helps the college to organise various events of the college with greater efficiency and effectiveness.
- Various activities in the department and college were documented in a visual format and presented to the stake holders.
