BEST PRACTICE -I

1. Title of the Practice : JAGAR (The College Extension Programme)

The meaning of Marathi Word JAGAR is to awake, aware to the society. JAGAR The College Extension Programme is an extension programme, an integral part of Social Work education. The College aspires to focus on the overall personality development of the students along with the academic excellence. It is one of the best practices used to realize the goals of the College - the empowerment of urban, rural and tribal society and bringing about social changes.

2. Goal

The objectives of JAGAR (The College Extension Programme) are)

- The Main goal is to give platform for student to develop their skill and technique to address social problems, issues through using integrated Social Work practice
- Sensitizing people on social issues and mobilize people towards social justice and development.
- To provide social dimension to the educational system of the College and inculcate social responsibility and commitment in students
- To bring forth the team spirit and leadership qualities of the students and broaden their social outlook that will help them work for the welfare of the community
- To restore gender equity and make available equal opportunities to emerge full-fledged and take up new ventures
- Networking with social institutions for strengthening social system of society.

3. The Context

In this context it is important to help students understand the social issues and problems which will further help them in creating awareness in society. Today's students are tomorrow's professional Social Workers and bear the responsibility of bringing about social change. Social Work strongly believes that it is important to work with the marginalized and weaker sections of the society. Hence it is imperative on the part of the College to extend their service and give exposure which is the dire need of the people. JAGAR is dauntless in launching well-planned activities

4. The Practice

JAGAR is a programme, unique in its context and practice. Various activities are carried out in this Program. Which help students to build personality, self confidence and motivate other students to overcome from introverted situation.

Mainly carried out following programs are listed below.

- 1) Jagar – Annual social magazine
- 2) Annual social gathering (cultural programme)
- 3) Meticulous survey to identify the needs of the society.
- 4) Realistic assessment of available resources and drafting viable plans



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- 5) Activities undertaken by the students with the co-operation of the GOs, NGOs for the development of society

By this program student got chance to develop their creativity, ability of thinking, humanity and friendship among the students. The target groups in the society face several problems regarding access to education, health facility, drinking water supply, power supply and transport. The student volunteers of each class are taking up different tasks to reach specified target. The students are assigned the tasks related to Environment, Health and Hygiene, Education, People's organization, Application of Knowledge and Liaison with Government Agencies. Organizing awareness camps, rallies, street play, poster exhibition, meetings, conducting competitions and screening documentaries are the common techniques adopted by all the groups to perform their tasks and realize their goals.

Main activities taken in these extension activities are –

- **Issue Base Annual Magazine:** A very important, useful and informative activity of the College is the publication of —“JAGAR” an Issue based magazine. This magazine is being published every year since 2000. The magazine focuses on one current problem every year and the students and staff write articles, poems on that specific issue. In the year 2022-23 “75 YEARS OF INDEPENDENCE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT” was the issue selected by the committee. This magazine is very useful to the Social Work students for creating awareness on the social problems and it also provides an opportunity to develop their writing and contemplating ability.
- Annual social gathering ‘JAGAR’ is also a unique cultural event in which various cultural events presented by the students are related to social aspect. In the year 2022-2023 on 03&04 march 2023. The gathering of the College of Social Work is socially conscious and uplifting. In this students present their art through various cultural events such as one-act play, quiz, Drama, fancy dress, group dance, but as students of social work, they select some social issues to present their art. For example- Amrit Mahotsav of India's Independence, Violence against women, Superstitions, Student Suicide, Waste Management, The Importance of Voting etc. Students shed light on burning issues through their art and that is why the College of Social Work is a social awareness gathering.
- In social awareness programme, giving environmental education, advocating sanitation and makes a survey of health problems and gives required guidance.
 1. Awareness programme of election
 2. With the help of the P.R.A. Technique (participatory rural appraisal) the people of the village raised awareness about the problem in the village.
 1. Arrange the plastics mukt abhiyan.
 2. Adopted village sanitation.
 3. Awareness about waste management
 4. Plantation programme.
 5. Knowing the problems of villagers students participate in the 15th august gram sabha.



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- The student forms Youth Club, Women's Club. They also focus on the application of knowledge acquired by students in their respective subjects to the people in the work area.

The highlights of the work done by the students are as follows:

1]. On August 9, 2022 on the occasion of Amrit Mahotsav of Indian Independence at Dhanajin Nana Chaudhari Vidya Prabodhini, LMC College of Social Work A collective national anthem was sung and Kranti day and world tribal day were celebrated. On the occasion of the world tribal day they saluted the great freedom fighter Dhanaji Nana Chaudhari who worked for the development of the tribals of Satpuda by striking the statue.

Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav was celebrated from 9th to 17th August under the National Service Scheme department of the college. Various trees were planted in the premises of the college on 9th August by Dr. Rajendra Waghulde Principal of Shirish Madhukar Rao Chaudhari College Principal Dr. Rakesh Chaudhari, NSS coordinators, citizens of the college area and students were present on this occasion.

HAR GHAR TIRANGA - Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav was celebrated from 9th to 17th August.

On the occasion of Amrit Mahotsav, a rally was held in the college premises through the NSS and student development department tree plantation was done. At the same time, according to the order of the government National flag of India was distributed to the people living in the college premises as per the concept of "National flag on every house." People were informed about how to hoist and remove the national flag from their homes. On 15 August 2022 the Indian national flag was hoisted on all the houses in the college and the premises. India's Amrit Mahotsav year was celebrated with great enthusiasm.

2] On 30 Sep. 2022 In association with Loksevak Madhukarrao Chaudhari College of Social Work, Jalgaon and Jalgaon City Andhashradha Nirmulan Samiti the lecture series was organized in the college. On this occasion Dr. Pradeep Joshi, a famous psychiatrist from Jalgaon City, guided the students on the topic of "Women and Mental development." "Masculine tradition has always subordinated women despite their potential." Dr. Joshi expressed the opinion that if men change their mindset, there will definitely be changes in the society. Students were present on this occasion.

3] **Training program** Students of social work learn about various problems in the society and create awareness in the society to solve these problems, for that the students themselves need to be trained. The college provides opportunities for students to get such training.

On May 13, 2023, under the guidance of Yogesh Patil, Assistant Commissioner of Social Welfare Jalgaon, a one-day training was conducted on the topic of JADU TONA VIRODHI KAYADA (ANTI SUPERSTITION AND BLACK MAGIC ACT) PRESENTATION OF MIRACLES in association with Maharashtra Superstition Eradication Committee and Social Work College. In this camp, Prof. Digamber Katyare presented Miracles by giving information about scientific approach and dexterity. Dr. Rakesh Chaudhari Principal of the Social Work College gave detailed information about ANTI SUPERSTITION AND BLACK MAGIC ACT. Dr. Kalpana Bharambe and five students of the college participated in this camp.



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4] **Science through experiments** Our college is a social work college students of social work college spread scientific ideas by removing superstitions in the society. In line with that, science experiments were presented in the school at Tarsod by field work organization in association with National service scheme of college and Marathi Vigyan Parishad, Jalgaon. Prof. Dilip Bharambe secretary of Marathi science council, showed the students various experiments like Submarine Periscope, rope telephone through the concept of science. In this 300 heels were assembled into a plate and a person weighing 120 kg was placed on the plate and the science behind it was explained to the students.

5] **The Reading Inspiration Day** "The Reading Inspiration Day" was celebrated on the birth anniversary of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam in coordination with the National Service Scheme Department and student Development department of the college. On this day, the 90th anniversary of social welfare administration was celebrated in the college.

5] **Rally and street play** "The FIT INDIA FREEDOM INDIA" program was implemented from October 2 to 31 through the National service scheme in the college with the view of making the students understand the social responsibility of our Nation. On this occasion students took out a rally in the college premises and presented a street play based on the topic of Our responsibilities towards our country.

6] **National Voters Day** National Voters Day is celebrated from 25th January 2011 to make citizens of the country aware of their rights and responsibilities as voters. On the occasion of National Voters Day, the students of the college presented a street play based on the concept of 'MY VOTE IS MY FUTURE' in Tarsod village.

7] **collection of plastic** SWACHH BHARAT ABHIYAN was implemented through the National service scheme of KBC North Maharashtra university. Under this campaign, the students of National service scheme of the college participated in this campaign by informing people about the damage caused by plastic to the environment and collecting unused plastic from people. The plastic collected from different parts of Jalgaon city was deposited by the students to the Jalgaon Municipal corporation.

8] **Samata Dindi and Rally** Samata Dindi and Rally was held in association with LMC College of social work Jalgaon and Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar social justice Bhavan Jalgaon with the aim of creating equality justice, brotherhood in the society. principal Dr. Rakesh Chaudhari inaugurated the samata rally by showing the green flag. On this occasion, the volunteers of National service scheme of social work, Jalgaon city Mayor Mrs. Jayashree Mahajan, Commissioner Dr. Vidya Gaikwad, Assistant commissioner of social justice department Yogesh Patil and many officials were present. All program officers of NSS were also present.

9] **Intellectual property awareness mission-** Intellectual property awareness is an important issue in the education sector at present. Honorable Mayur Lokhande, Examiner of patents and Designs, Mumbai, and prof. V.V. Geete were invited to the college to impart information on intellectual property. prof. Geete explained the purpose of the intellectual property awareness mission and explained the role of University and the Government. Mrs. Mayur Lokhande explained what is an Intellectual property, what are its types, what are its



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benefits and also gave examples of properties from around the world. Principal of the college, all teachers and students were present on this occasion.

10] In the college BSW and MSW first year rural camp and NSS camp was organized at satpuda vikas mandal, Pal. This camp is a seven day residential camp. In this seven day camp, students learn all about the village and do various tasks for the development of the village. In the camp in the academic year 2022-23, the students conducted a cleanliness campaign with the help of the people of the village. People were made aware about cleanliness and addiction, women's education through street play. Students also got information about the village through PRA technique. PRA means Participatory rural appraisal. The development of any village is possible only with the participation of the people. Village evaluation also requires public participation. For this purpose, the students evaluated the village of Pal through public participation. With the help of the villagers, the complete layout of the village was drawn with the help of Rangoli. After this layout was completed, information was obtained about all the facilities in the village such as various institutions, primary health center, temple, masjid, water tank, ashram school etc. In this way the help of PRA, the people of the village became aware of the problem in the village.

Evidence of Success

JAGAR (The College Extension Programme) is running successfully by the students and various programs are organized every year and popularity of this programme is increasing in positive direction. The evidence of the success of the programme is available in the form of photos of the various programs, news published in the news papers, etc. Number of participants increasing every year is one of the best evidence of success of the activity.

Outcome (Target Groups)

The services of JAGAR (The College Extension Programme) have yielded satisfactory results to various disciplines with their hard labour and selfless service. The outcome of the outstanding performances is highlighted below:

- College is getting fame as a mediator between Government and people
- Imparted social and moral values
- Helped to create healthy and pollution-free society
- Created opportunity for sharing the knowledge and experience of the senior citizens
- Enabled people to avail the Government Welfare schemes like widow's pension, Voters ID, ID for the differently-abled etc.
- Given awareness of fatal diseases like AIDS and T.B.
- Tackled health hazards by maintaining good health and hygiene
- Eradicated illiteracy by encouraging the school dropouts for readmission at schools

- The following are some of the awareness programmes conducted by Jagar
- Blood donation camp is arranged every year in which awareness about importance of blood donation is conveyed to the peoples through street plays.
- Health camps such as Eye check up, Heart check up, Hemoglobin check up for women are arranged for people with help of the various expert agencies.
- Women empowerment is the key aspect of JAGAR in which creating and reviving SHG, Health Check-up, enlightening programmes are arranged.
- School dropout is the problem in government schools, students have worked on it they visit to dropout student's house meet their parents tells them importance of education which helps to reduce school dropouts.

5. Problems encountered and resources required

JAGAR (The College Extension Programme) has found the public reluctant to involve themselves in the extension activities proposed by the College because of inadequacy of time and the necessity to earn their livelihood through hard labour. Exhaustion and lack of interest are the major impediments for their inability to participate in the welfare activities.

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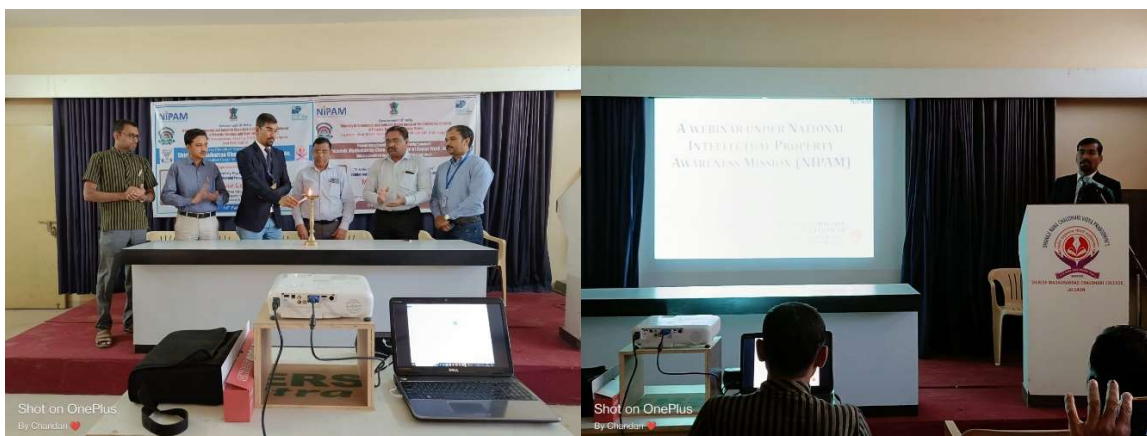

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Best Practice – II

1. **Title of the Practice :** Nature Club

2. **Goal:**

1. To create awareness among the students about the environmental issues.
2. To teach students skills and techniques for the proper use of *natural resources*
3. To promote the need of sustainable development among students and society.
4. To enable students to think and act as environmentalist.
5. To inspire students to think in innovative way to solve environmental problems.

3. **The Context:**

The goal of Nature club is to instil eco-friendly values and develop skills and tools necessary to understand and appreciate the symbiotic relationship among humans, their culture and their bio-physical surrounding and thereby reaffirm an environmental ethics built on interdependence and interrelationship with the mother earth. The ultimate aim is 'Green consciousness for green learning and green living' More specifically, it aims at radically transforming current consciousness and thereby promoting and enhancing green consciousness among students, staff and various stakeholders by showcasing models of green behavior and practices

4. **The Practice:**

I. **Green Campus:** Greening the environment is a priority activity that the institution is undertaking with the firm conviction that the environment shapes our consciousness, learning practices and life itself. In which we plant trees in and outside the campus with the help of students through various activities.

II. **Environmental Tour (Nisarga Sahal):** Under this project every year we organize one or two day environmental tour for students. In this tour we give exposure to students about environmental issues and beauty of nature. In this year faculty member and students visited various projects like SVM, KVK, Medicinal plant project and student were guided on how to prepare vermicompost and how to cultivate mushrooms.

Students also visit villages (Adivasi Padas) Titaranya (MP), Gadgyam (MP) along with pal and sahastraling village. students visited tribal padas and discussed about tribals and learned about their culture. Also learned how forests are important to tribal people, what crops they grow in agriculture, what animals and birds do they keep? students know that forest is very important for tribals, tribal people have domestic animal like goats, chickens, cows and bulls.

Student also visit the shiva cave temple. The shiva cave temple is situated between the two tribals pada Gadgyam and padalya. This temple is very ancient and is located in a naturally formed cave under a Banyan tree. There is river sukhi in the vicinity of the temple. students observed the nature around the temple.

III. **News paper scraping** – In this activity students collect articles, news, photos and information related to beauty of nature and environmental issues through newspaper



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,magazines and the Internet. In the academic year 2022-23 students submitted papers based on RESEARCH AND CURRENT AFFAIRS IN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE.

IV. Tree Planting Program - The students planted two trees in the locality where they live through the nature club .students planted and nurtured mango, wad, pimple and medicinal plant trees.

V .Mural Exhibition competition-Through the Nature club students created posters based on the themes of AMRIT MAHOTSAV OF INDIA'S INDEPENDENCE and cleanliness Mission. These posters were exhibited in various field work organization and villages.

RANGOLI COMPETITION ON ENVIRONMENT – On march 3,2023, a Rangoli competition was held for students based on environment.

VI CLEANLINESS Campaign- Through Nature Club, students conducted swachhata Abhiyan in the locality where they live and also involved the people living in the locality in this campaign.

Other activities undertaken by the Nature Club for creation of Environment awareness are:

- Organizes seminars & lectures on contemporary environmental issues to increase the environmental awareness of the students.
- Organizes regular Poster Exhibition and Environmental & health awareness camp in collaboration with Governmental and Non Governmental Organizations.
- The wall magazine of the Eco Club, is being published 4 times a year
- The Founder President of the Dhanaji Nana Chaudhari Vidya Prabodhini Jalgaon, Late Shree Loksevak Madhukarrao Chaudhari (Hon.Ex. Speaker, And Minister Maharashtra Legislative Assembly.) has actively participated to make the Bio-diversity in Tribal region of Satpuda ranges at Pal Tal. Raver, District Jalgaon, of Maharashtra State, with him College of Social Work's Staff and Students also actively participated in which Drives like Various Surveys, Awareness campaign, Tree Plantation, Water Conservation etc. by this initiative taken by the College to create environmental consciousness among the students.

5. Evidence of Success:

There is a general change in the attitude and behavior of the students which is pro environmental and has enhanced sensitivity to nature. They have started taking personal ownership in greening the campus and field work places, maintaining its biodiversity and following up green practices. Students were able to cultivate a considerable amount of vegetables and plant newer varieties of plants at their home. The students were able to sustain the interest in gardening and environment management. Due to impact of our programme our students through field work practice make aware to community. We provide the models and posters to various agencies for Exhibition which is created by our students under Nature Club.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:



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- Limited number of students: The College has only one PG and one UG courses and the maximum number of students per year is 40 for UG and 60 for PG, which constrains planning of projects and ensuring its continuity.
 - Irregular pattern of semester system and the exam schedules.
 - Financial Constraints: limited financial flow affects the quality and quantity of work.
 - Lack of specific and/or specialized knowledge in the area of climate, soil, saplings and manure also affected the practice.

Resources Required

- Availability of experts with specific knowledge
- Free flow of financial assistance
- Incentives to student groups for successful showcasing of activities
- Special classes can be arranged for the students to inculcate the necessity of such programmes and the importance of their participation
- More involvement of the stakeholders and local authorities required

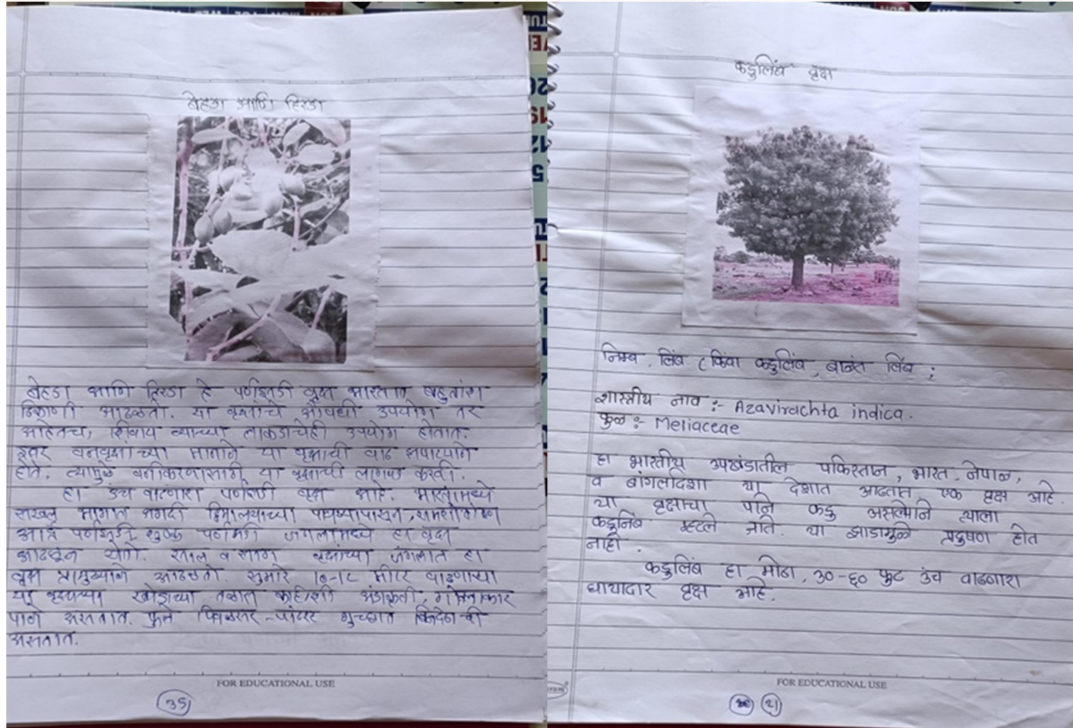

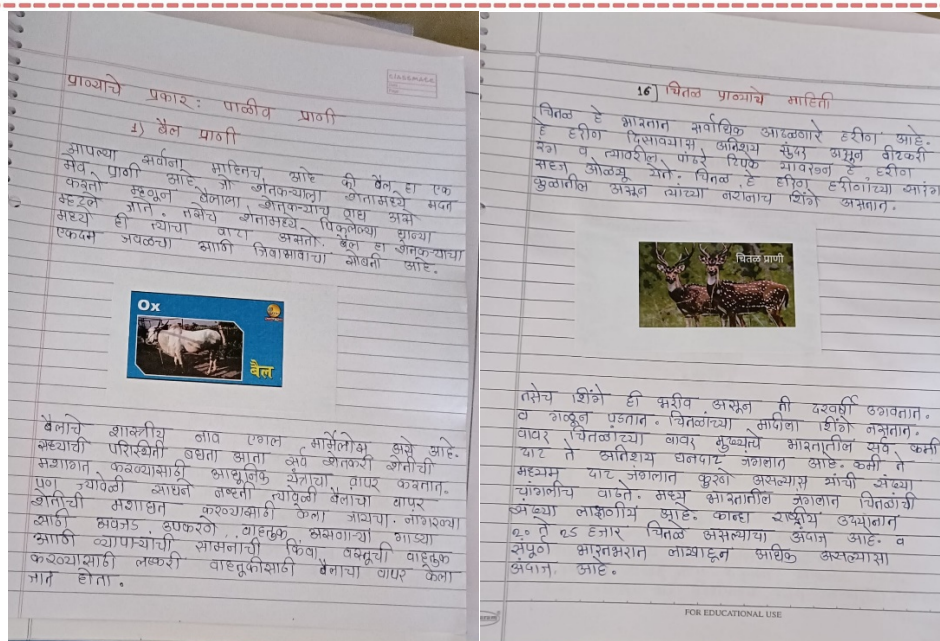
