The MSW Research Orientation Programme for the academic year 2019-20 achieved several significant outcomes:





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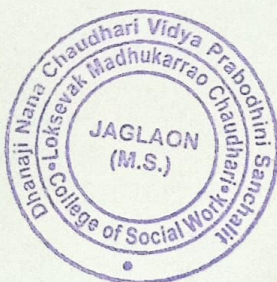
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1. **Enhanced Research Knowledge:** Participants deepened their understanding of research methodologies and ethical considerations, building a solid foundation for their future research endeavors.
